The PW Global Exchange Program

The Global Exchange is a triennial program of Presbyterian Women that focuses on building relationships with church partners, women's organizations and especially Christian sisters around the world. Participants are nominated through their synods and selected by the Global Exchange Committee. Each participant is expected to itinerate and interpret for two years after the exchange.

In October, 23 Presbyterian women and four PW and PC(USA) staff traveled to northern India for the triennial Global Exchange. The group was hosted by the Church of North India (CNI) Women's Fellowship for Christian Service (WFCS) in Delhi, Agra, Kolkata and Durgapur, and by the Presbyterian Women's Fellowship, Presbyterian Church of India (PCI), in Shillong.

Women from India will complete the exchange in 2012, visiting PC(USA) synods and attending the PW Gathering in Orlando, July 18–22. Presbyterian Women Birthday Offering What Is the Birthday Offering?

The Birthday Offering is a PW offering collected in the spring of each year to celebrate the blessings in the lives of Presbyterian Women. The offering funds up to five projects that are not included in ongoing General Assembly mission support, such as agricultural development, child care, community organization, criminal justice, drug counseling, economic justice, elderly care, employment training, homelessness, literacy, violence and women's concerns. In August 2011, the committee reviewed 32 proposals and selected three projects as recipients of the 2012 Birthday Offering. Thank Offering grants helped two of the parent organizations begin their ministries; now Birthday Offering grants can help the organizations move in new and vital directions. The grant amounts for the projects will depend on gifts contributed during 2012. **The goal for the 2012 Birthday Offering is \$900,000.**

2012 Birthday Offering Grant Recipients

Circle of Friends: Celebrating Life, Inc. Living Water for Girls

Peachtree City, Georgia Circle of Friends: Celebrating Life, Inc. serves, empowers and equips women to help other women and youth. The organization's newest program, Living Water for Girls, will rescue, rehabilitate and provide safe refuge for young American girls who are victims of sex trafficking and exploitation. Birthday Offering gifts will allow Living Water for Girls to offer their services on a self-contained campus, ensuring the safety of the girls. A garage will be converted into classrooms, staff offices, counseling space and a commercial kitchen (for culinary training). After a small chapel is constructed, it will house additional educational and counseling programs, as well as worship and Bible study.

New Opportunities for Romanian Orphaned Children (NOROC) Gymnasium and Activity Center

Tulcea, Romania New Opportunities for Romanian Orphaned Children (NOROC) is a program that shares God's love and blessings with children who have been orphaned. NOROC facilitates the spiritual, social, physical and emotional development of these vulnerable children. The organization offers these supports to various racial and ethnic groups, including a large Roma population. After the state-owned gym used by NOROC was repurposed. NOROC had no facility for team activities and physical play. A Birthday Offering grant will help make possible the purchase of land and the construction of a gymnasium/activity center for the roughly 400 children served by NOROC.

Synod of the Sun Solar Under the Sun (SUTS)

Irving, Texas

Solar Under the Sun (SUTS) trains lay people to lead teams in the installation of solar-powered energy systems. The systems provide clean, inexpensive and long-lasting energy in low-income communities, supplying power for health, education and communications services. Half of the Birthday Offering grant will be used to install a variety of solar panel equipment at Ferncliff Camp in Arkansas, where church mission teams can be trained on installation techniques through a lens of mission partnership. The other half of the grant will match funds for the purchase of solar panels and related hardware for projects in Haiti, where SUTS currently focuses.

Welcome to a new Together in Service partner, Little Dresses for Africa! This nondenominational Christian mission organization was founded by Rachel O'Neill to provide simple dresses for orphans and schoolchildren in Africa. Their mission statement is: "To plant in the hearts of little girls that they're worthy." The organization serves children around the world (including Appalachia and South Dakota) with homemade dresses and simple shorts for boys. Commercially produced clothing is not acceptable, as customs regulations for those items make import fees prohibitive. Thank you to the several PW groups around the country who wrote to recommend this amazing grassroots mission program! Over 500,000 dresses have been sewn and shipped to needy children. Process Change for PW Memorial and Recognition Gifts

The Churchwide Coordinating Team (CCT) recently approved a change to the process around receipt and acknowledgement of memorial and recognition gifts made to PW. This change reflects current work practices and best standards in giving.

Previously, blank recognition and memorial certificates were sent to treasurers at least once a year and upon request. Any time a memorial or recognition gift was made within the presbytery, the PW in the Presbytery treasurer sent the check to PW and completed the blank certificate. There was no way of ensuring gifts were made to PW and no way of confirming who had received the memorial/recognition honor. A receipt/thank-you was sent based on the gifts received; it was sent to the treasurer.

Beginning January 1, 2012, there will be a new process. Blank certificates will no longer be sent to treasurers. Instead, when an individual or group mails the money for a memorial or recognition gift to the PWP treasurer, they should also send a form (available on PW's website) that includes the addresses of both the donor/s and the honoree, and a choice as to preferred person to sign the certificate—national or local PW leaders. A receipt for donation will be sent to the donor/s along with a certificate including the honoree's name, and a blank space for leader signatures or signatures from national leaders provided.

The new process will allow PW to better track donors, honorees and gifts, and acknowledge them appropriately. If there is a need to create a last-minute certificate, upon request, PW staff can assist leaders via phone or email with the creation of certificates using common computer programs.
